

Authorship guidelines March 2022

This Authorship policy pertains to all publications and abstracts produced using data from the Australasian ILD Registry (AILDR). This policy addresses authorship criteria from single centre and multi-centre research proposals. Authorship criteria are based on the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE) <u>Uniform Requirements for Manuscripts Submitted to Biomedical Journals</u>. The ICMJE lists four conditions for authorship credit. Authors must meet all four conditions in order to be listed.

- Substantial contributions to conception and design, acquisition of data, or analysis and interpretation of data, and
- Drafting the article or revising it critically for important intellectual content, and
- Final approval of the version to be published, and
- Agreement to be accountable for all aspects of the work in ensuring that questions related to the accuracy or integrity of any part of the work are appropriately investigated and resolved

1. Publications or abstracts arising from a single centre where the recruiting physician/health professional is using their own data

 In this situation, the recruiting physician/health professional will determine authorship, however the AILDR should be acknowledged to recognise the existence of the Registry, and its role in data quality control. The University of Sydney, Lung Foundation Australia and the Centre of Research Excellence for Pulmonary Fibrosis (founders and supporters of the Registry) also require acknowledgement.

2. Publications or abstracts arising from more than one centre

- In this situation, an open invitation for authorship will be extended to all AILDR Steering Committee members before the work is started and confirmed before submitting the manuscript for publication.
- In general, there will be one principal investigator listed as an author from each contributing site. In order to contribute to authorship, sites must be actively involved in recruitment and data entry (in the previous 6 months). The principal investigator can nominate an alternative author for their site if appropriate. Multiple authors from a single site will be considered if there is a major contribution to a study from that site.

For External researcher led projects, a Co-Investigator (Steering Committee member) must be nominated to advise and review all manuscripts arising from AILDR data before publication.

- All members of the group named as authors should meet all four ICMJE criteria for authorship, including approval of the final manuscript, and they should be able to take public responsibility for the work and should have full confidence in the accuracy and integrity of the work of other group authors.
- If there are a very large number of authors, some journal may ask for confirmation that everyone listed met the ICMJE criteria for authorship. If they did, the journal may then require that the authors form a group whose name will appear in the article byline (eg on behalf of AILDR Steering Committee).
- We appreciate that authors may be concerned that their work will not be properly recognised if they form a group, but <u>Medline guidance</u> can handle group authorship and still give each individual due credit:

"When a group name for a specific consortium, committee, study group, or the like appears in an article byline, the personal names of the members of that group may be published in the article text. Such names are entered as collaborator names for the Medline citation."

- Contributors who do not meet the criteria for authorship should be mentioned in the Acknowledgments. It is expected that those being acknowledged have given their permission to be named.
- Recruiting physicians/health professionals who are not directly involved in the design or conduct of the research, and whose data is not used as part of the research project will not be cited as authors.
- The AILDR, The University of Sydney, Lung Foundation Australia and the Centre of Research Excellence for Pulmonary Fibrosis (and any other future funding bodies) will be acknowledged as above. Details as to the wording of the acknowledgements required will be provided to the authors at the time of manuscript submission by the project coordinator.
